TOP VASE COMPETITION RULES

1. The Top Vase class is for a vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between 5 and 10, taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants.

Please note that it is two different KINDS of plants, two varieties of the same plant are NOT two kinds.

2. The display is judged out of a total of 35 points, split into: 25 points for the colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display, and 10 points for the overall presentation and effect of the flowers in the vase.

The vase will be viewed from all directions. Judging of flowers should be to the normal rules used for other classes.

- **3.** Stems used in the display must be showing flowers only; no seed heads or berries will be allowed.
- **4.** The vase can be any shape and size and made from any material, but must be in proportion to the display. No marks are awarded for the vase itself.
- **5.** No accessories such as bows and additional foliage will be allowed. Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem, and still attached to that stem, is allowed. Packing material including florists' foam to keep the stems in place is allowed.

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS AND JUDGES

- *Flowering stems can be taken from ANY flowering plant.
- * The different kinds of plants need to be taken from different genera. For instance, pinks, carnations and sweet william which are all dianthus would not be classed as different kinds.
- * Use only fresh, home-grown flowers. No dried or silk flowers allowed.
- *A vase, by definition, is any vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest point.
- * The Garden News Top Vase class is open for anyone to enter and is not intended purely for growers who regularly display in single species classes at shows.
- * Judges should use their discretion when judging the Top Vase class, bearing in mind that the entries may come from inexperienced exhibitors.
- * Please note that the display has to be viewed all round.
- * The points awarded should be clearly marked by the judges on the exhibitors' cards.
- * Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above rules, should be referred to, and decided by, the show officials.

Failure to abide by any of these rules will lead to disqualification.

TOP TRAY COMPETITION RULES

1. The Garden News Top Tray class is for a collection of three types of vegetables taken from the following list of fifteen. The quantity of each vegetable required for the collection is given in brackets: carrots (3), cauliflowers (2), onions (3), parsnips (3), peas (6 pods), potatoes (3), runner beans (6 pods), tomatoes (6), French Beans (6 pods), sweetcorn (2), pepper (3), cucumber (2), courgettes (3), red beet (3), aubergines (2). Each type of vegetable will be judged out of a total of 20 points. This is split into three sections as

follows: 7 points for size, shape and colour; 7 points for condition; 6 points for uniformity. The overall mark will be out of a total of 60.

2. All vegetables are to be displayed for effect. The vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 45cm by 60cm (18x24in), without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray.

A tray or board measuring 45cm by 60cm (18x24in) can be used to display the vegetables, or the area can simply be marked on the staging. Where a tray has a lip or edge, it is the internal measurements that must not exceed 45cm by 60cm (18x24in).

3. A black cloth is permitted, and the tray may be painted. Parsley is allowed for garnishing, but no other foliage or accessories, such as plates, sand, rings and so on, will be allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia or string.

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS AND JUDGES

- *Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed back to 7.5cm (3in).
- *Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached.
- * Tomatoes must be displayed with calvees (the green flower bud case).
- * Judges may handle exhibits, open pods etc to check for quality.
- * The tray, board or staging must not be cut or mutilated in any way at all such as cutting holes for standing onions in.
- * Judges should use their discretion when judging the Top Tray class, remembering that entries may come from inexperienced exhibitors.
- * The points awarded should be clearly marked by the judges on the exhibitors' cards.
- * Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above rules, should be referred to, and decided by, the show officials.

Failure to abide by any of these rules will lead to disqualification.



RULES

- All competitors must conform to these Rules and any infringement will result in disqualification.
- Subscriptions due at the AGM for the following year and must be paid by the Spring Show - Annual £5. Exhibitors must be members to enter shows or pay £1 per entry.
- 3. It is essential that all floral art entrants send in a completed entry form with membership fee no later than two days before the show. It is advisable that entries to other classes are submitted at this stage. Entries for other classes than floral art classes will usually be accepted if space is available.
- 4. All entry forms to rhsofperthshire@gmail.com
 - All competitors are held to declare that the articles exhibited by them are their own growing or have been in their possession for at least two months. (Plants and materials for Floral Art excepted). Bakery, preserves, handicrafts and photographs to be exhibited must be the exhibitor's own work.
- 5. STAGING TIMES SUMMER SHOW Thursday 16th AUG from 5 PM -11 PM & Friday 17th 8AM—8.30AM
 - JUDGING TO COMMENCE AT 8.30AM Friday 17th AUGUST
- 6. The Show will be open to the public from 1 pm until 4 pm on Friday and 10am 4.30pm on Saturday
 - **Trophies and Special Awards** will be presented at 4 pm on Saturday.
 - **Prize Money** will be paid out only between 12 noon and 4pm on Saturday with any unclaimed prize money being returned to society funds.
- 7. No competitor will stage more than one exhibit in any one class except if otherwise specified.
- All cut flowers to be inserted in water in vases supplied by the Society.
 Bottles, Jam Jars and similar containers will not be permitted.

 ALL CUT FLOWER CLASSES to be exhibited in solid-based vases. Check information in hall beside vases when staging your exhibits.
 - OTHER CLASSES AND JUNIOR SECTION in vase appropriate to exhibit
- 9. Where two or more exhibits are otherwise equal in value, preference will be given to those correctly and distinctly named.
- 10. Before any exhibit is placed into position, an **Entry Card** must be obtained from the Secretary. This label must be filled in and placed next to the exhibit.
- 11. The decision of the judges shall be final and no protest will be entertained against any award except on the grounds that these Rules have been violated. If any competitor is unhappy with the judges decision this must be taken up with the Show Day Organiser.
- 12. In the event of the judges failing to agree on any one exhibit, they must call one other judge, but only one is permitted. Judges will have the power to withhold or modify the prizes, when the exhibits are deemed by them to be unworthy of a standard award or awards.
- 13. In the event of any one or more of the judges being unable to attend on the morning of the Show, the Directors will have the power to appoint one or more as necessary to fill the vacancies.

- 15. During the Show period members of the Directorate shall constitute the Emergency Committee and shall meet when called by the Secretary with a quorum of three.
- 16. In the event of the funds being insufficient to pay the prize-money in full, after providing for all other liabilities, the Directors reserve the right to reduce the prize money by what they consider a fair percentage and upon being paid this reduced prize-money the competitors shall have no further claim against the Society.
- 17. The committee will take all possible care of the articles shown, but the Society shall not be responsible for any loss or damage which may arise from any cause whatsoever to the plants, flowers, fruit, vegetables, stands, vases or other articles either as exhibits or utilised in the exhibiting.
- 18. ALL TROPHIES MUST BE SIGNED FOR AFTER THE AWARDS CEREMONY. All trophies are to be kept in good order by the holders and returned to the Trophy Secretary (01738 635018) by the staging evening of the show.
- 19. In pointing for competitions, 3 points will be awarded for 1st prize, 2 points for 2nd prize and 1 point for 3rd prize.
- 20. Chrysanthemum and Dahlia Classes will be judged in accordance with NCS and NDS rules. All vegetable collections to be judged on NVS points system.

NAFAS RULES

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material. with or without accessories, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule. Exhibits must be staged at the show venue unless otherwise stated in the show schedule.

NAFAS Rules state that disqualification will take place for the following reasons:

- 1. Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, e.g. the measurements or the components.
- 2. Inclusion of fresh plant material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material. Exceptions: air plants, cacti, fruits, fungi, grass turf, lichen, moss, succulents, vegetables and long-lasting plant material WHICH WILL REMAIN TURGID FOR THE DURATION OF THE SHOW. (Definition of "Turgid" the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plants cells to be fully expanded).
- 3. Inclusion of artificial plant material, unless specifically allowed by a show schedule.
 - Many techniques, whether con temporary or traditional, require a great deal of time to complete. Pre —done work of this type is acceptable in any class, unless specifically excluded by the show schedule.
 - For further details and definitions please refer to the NAFAS "Competitions Manual", Third Edition 2015, in accordance with which all classes will be judged.
